Comments by the CEO

The third quarter was another solid quarter for Billerud. As we had planned, our net sales grew, and profitability improved in both regions. The positive profitability trend we have seen from the beginning of the year continued. The Group's EBITDA margin ended at 14%, our strongest result since Q4 2022. Production stability was solid in the quarter and our scheduled maintenance stops in three mills went according to plan.

Yet again, region North America delivered an excellent financial performance with double digit sales growth and 18% EBITDA margin. All our categories in the US contributed to the strong result. In Region Europe, our fiber cost continued to increase, while most other input costs declined. Also for this quarter, we were successfully able to offset the cost inflation by proactive pricing and portfolio management for Europe. This is key and it will continue to be one of our top priorities going forward. Region Europe reached an EBITDA margin of 16%, the highest profitability in two years.

Our efficiency enhancement program continues to deliver structural savings. Disciplined work to eliminate price point outliers in the customer base as well as to increase our field-purchased pulpwood in the vicinity of our Swedish mills produces positive effects. The reduction of 350 positions throughout the entire company, that was announced a year ago, has progressed well and is now close to completion. We are well on track to outperform this year's target for the efficiency enhancement program of SEK 700 million EBITDA uplift compared to 2023.

The market sentiment improved slightly in the third quarter as we had anticipated. However, we see now that the demand in several of our board and packaging paper categories is weakening. The underlying consumption of goods and packaging is at the moment below the long-term growth expectation. This is in particular true for Region Europe. We therefore expect to have a period of slower volume demand and pressure on pricing for most of our product categories. However, as input costs are not coming down, we will do our outmost to protect margins by continuing our relentless focus on price and mix management. We will drive value over volume across the company and apply an agile mindset for our production schedule.

The current market sentiment in the US is in comparison more stable, with the underlying consumption in a somewhat better shape. For the fourth quarter, we foresee stable market conditions in North America, with maintained prices for graphic and specialty paper and largely unchanged input costs. Our graphic paper has had a strong start of the quarter in the wake of the presidential election and Billerud is well placed as the natural choice of domestically produced material. For our maple hardwood pulp, we have seen significant pricing pressure during the third quarter and that is expected to continue towards the year-end.



We continue to focus on a few and selected priorities for the remainder of 2024:

- Execute our revised European strategy to mitigate the structurally higher wood costs
- Deliver our efficiency enhancement program
- Prepare for strategic investment projects

We and our JV partner Viken Skog AS were surprised and disappointed that our application for an environmental permit in Follum was rejected. We are confident in our consequence analysis of the project and will appeal this decision. Our plan to start bleached chemi-thermomechanical pulp (BCTMP) production at this existing production facility is supported by the local community and we have good hopes that the permit will be granted.

A lot of things have changed since we arranged our last Capital Markets Day (CMD) in November 2021. We have acquired Verso and the premise for the Nordic pulp and paper industry has changed dramatically since Russia's war on Ukraine. We have developed a solid and exciting plan for both of our regions, and we look forward to hosting you at our CMD the 2nd of December, to convey our "Way Forward" and the next chapter for Billerud.

Third quarter

Sales and results

Net sales for the third quarter increased by 6% to SEK 10,798 million (10,210). Currency changes had a negative impact of 2%. The organic* and currency-neutral net sales increased by 9%, mainly due to improved sales prices in Europe and higher sales volumes in North America compared to last year. The Group's sales volumes totaled 898 ktons (890), negatively impacted by curtailments of production in Region North America.

Adjusted EBITDA amounted to SEK 1,555 million (1,167), corresponding to a margin of 14% (11). The Group's result increased mainly because of higher net sales, favorable mix changes and efficiency gains, which were only partly offset by higher input costs. Annual maintenance shutdowns were in the third quarter carried out in the mills in Gävle, Karlsborg and Escanaba, with a total cost impact of SEK 348 million.

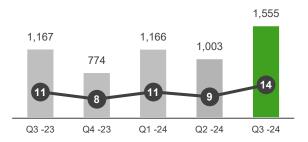
No items classified as affecting comparability were recorded in the third quarter of 2024 (-55). Items that affected the comparability in the result in the third quarter 2023 totaled SEK -55 million and included a capital gain from the divestment of Managed Packaging of SEK 23 million, a cost item related to an impairment of shares in Paper Bottle Company AS of SEK 52 million and restructuring costs for management severance pay of SEK 26 million.

Market development and outlook

In the third quarter, there was a slight improvement in market conditions for all of Billerud's paper and board categories except for liquid packaging board, where market conditions were stable on a normal level. Price increases were implemented for sack and kraft paper, containerboard and cartonboard. Prices were unchanged for liquid packaging board, graphic and specialty paper, while prices for market pulp declined during the quarter.

For the fourth quarter 2024, Billerud expects softer demand and price pressure for most categories in Region Europe, meaning sack and kraft paper, containerboard and cartonboard. Market conditions for liquid packaging board, graphic paper and specialty paper are expected to be stable. Input costs are expected to increase, mainly due to higher wood prices in the Nordics and increased energy costs. The price of market pulp is expected to have a negative impact.

Events in the quarter

On 1 July, Gert Larsson assumed the position of SVP Operations, Billerud Europe and joined the Group Management Team. Gert Larsson has previously been SVP and Head of Operations for the Packaging Materials division in Stora Enso and EVP, Hiab Products at Cargotec.

On 9 September, Billerud Viken AS, the joint venture formed by Billerud and the Norwegian forest association Viken Skog AS, received a rejection on its application for an environmental permit to produce bleached chemi-thermomechanical pulp (BCTMP) in Follum, Norway from the Norwegian Environment Agency. Billerud Viken AS has subsequently decided to appeal this decision. An environmental permit is a necessary condition for the plans to start BCTMP production in Follum to become a reality.

On 18 September, Doug Schwartz was appointed President, Billerud North America and a member of the company's Group Management Team. Doug Schwartz has extensive experience in the US forest and paper industry, including from leadership roles at International Paper and Champion International Corporation. He most recently held the position of Vice President and General Manager, Rigid Paper Containers at Sonoco.

Events after the quarter

On 1 October, Billerud agreed on a transfer of a pension obligations and related assets in the US, which is expected to result in a positive result effect of approximately USD 25 million. The pension obligation transfer has no cash flow impact. The result effect will be reported as an item affecting comparability in the operating segment Other in the fourth quarter of 2024.

Matthew Hirst, President Billerud Europe, has decided to leave Billerud for personal reasons. He will remain in his role until 31 January 2025. The recruitment of a new President Billerud Europe will begin immediately.

Net sales for the third quarter amounted to SEK 6,980 million (6,765). Net sales excluding currency effects grew by 5% because of higher sales prices and positive mix changes, while sales volumes decreased.

EBITDA amounted to SEK 1,106 million (902), corresponding to an EBITDA margin of 16% (13). The profit improvement was mainly due to the sales growth achieved through positive price and mix changes, which were only partially offset by higher costs for wood raw materials, logistics and energy.

During the quarter, scheduled maintenance shutdowns were carried out in Karlsborg and Gävle mills with a total cost impact of SEK 262 million. The negative earnings impact from maintenance shutdowns in the third quarter of 2023 was SEK 293 million.

Market development

During the third quarter of 2024, the market conditions for Billerud's product categories in Region Europe improved slightly. Price increases were implemented for sack and kraft paper, containerboard and cartonboard. For liquid packaging board, sales prices were unchanged. The total cost of fiber increased, while costs for chemicals, transports and energy decreased compared to the previous quarter.

About Region Europe

Region Europe includes the board and paper products made of virgin fibre that are manufactured at the mills Gruvön, Gävle, Frövi/Rockhammar, Skärblacka and Karlsborg in Sweden and Pietarsaari in Finland. In these mills, Billerud produces liquid packaging board, kraft paper, containerboard, cartonboard, sack paper and market pulp. These materials are sold in Europe and the rest of the world. Total production capacity is around 3.1 million tons per year.

EBITDA, SEKm and EBITDA margin, %

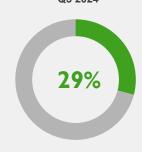

Sales and results

Net sales for the third quarter amounted to SEK 3,138 million (2,839). Net sales excluding currency effects grew by 15% primarily because of increased sales volumes, but also due to increased sales prices. The capacity utilization increased during the third quarter 2024 but production remained below full capacity.

EBITDA increased to SEK 575 million (467), corresponding to an EBITDA margin of 18% (16). The EBITDA improvement was mainly a result of the increased net sales as well as lower input costs related to wood and energy prices.

During the quarter, a scheduled maintenance shutdown was carried out in the Escanaba mill with a cost impact of SEK 86 million. The negative earnings impact from maintenance shutdowns in the third quarter of 2023 was SEK 83 million.

Market development

During the third quarter of 2024, the market conditions for the materials produced in Region North America improved slightly. The price for Billerud's market pulp decreased during the quarter, while prices for graphic and speciality paper were stable. Total input costs increased somewhat compared to the previous quarter.

About Region North America

Region North America includes the products made of virgin fibre manufactured at the Escanaba and Quinnesec mills in Michigan, US and the operations at the sheeting facility Wisconsin Rapids in Wisconsin, US. Billerud produces graphic and specialty paper as well as market pulp in this region and sells these materials primarily in the North American market. Total annual production capacity is around 1.1 million tons of paper and 200 thousand tons of pulp.

Other

Sales and results

Net sales for the third quarter amounted to SEK 680 million (606). The sales growth was mainly because of higher sales in wood sourcing operations and positive effects from currency hedging. Managed Packaging, which was divested on 31 August 2023, had net sales of SEK 115 million in the third quarter 2023.

EBITDA in the third quarter of 2024 amounted to SEK -126 million (-257). The positive change was mainly due to positive effects from currency hedging.

Sales and results

Net sales for the first nine months increased by 1% to SEK 31,985 million (31,658). Net sales excluding currency effects grew by 1% as a result of higher sales in both regions compared with the corresponding period last year.

Adjusted EBITDA increased to SEK 3,724 million (2,839), corresponding to an EBITDA margin of 12%. The improved result was mainly related to higher sales volumes, positive contribution from efficiency enhancement program and lower impact from revaluation of finished goods inventory than during the first nine months of 2023.

Items classified as affecting comparability of SEK -119 million (-55) impacted the results for the period January–September 2024. These items were related to recognized costs for the US transformation program of SEK 189 million as well as the positive result from the divestment of assets related to the Wisconsin Water Quality Center (WQC) of SEK 70 million, both of which occurred in the second quarter.

Cash flow and financial position

Operating cash flow after investments in tangible and intangible assets amounted to SEK -71 million (444) for the third quarter of 2024. The cash flow from operating activities decreased to SEK 438 million (1,082), primarily because of a negative development in cash flow from changes in working capital, due to increased inventory and decreased accounts payables. Higher profit before tax had a positive impact on the cash flow from operating activities.

Financing

On 30 September 2024, the interest-bearing debt amounted to SEK 7,567 million (7,439). Interest-bearing debt decreased by SEK 124 million during the third quarter of 2024. The Group repaid commercial papers of SEK 650 million including interest and issued new commercial papers of SEK 566 million.

The interest-bearing net debt on 30 September 2024 amounted to SEK 6,930 million (6,937).

The net interest-bearing debt in relation to EBITDA at the end of the period was 1.7 (1.4). The net interest-bearing debt in relation to adjusted EBITDA was 1.5 (1.4)

Investments and capital employed

Investments in tangible and intangible assets amounted to SEK 1,824 million (2,204) for the first nine months of 2024. The decrease was mainly due to lower capital expenditures for the new recovery boiler in Frövi, that was taken into operation during the second half of 2023.

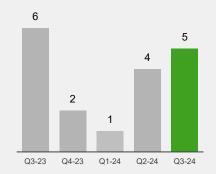
The investments in tangible and intangible assets during 2024 are expected to total approximately SEK 2.3 billion. Of this amount, SEK 1.6 billion is attributable to Region Europe and SEK 0.7 billion to Region North America.

The capital employed on 30 September 2024 amounted to SEK 34,130 million (34,686). Return on capital employed (ROCE) for the last twelve months amounted to 4% (6). Adjusted ROCE was 5% (6).

Return on equity was 2% (6) for the last twelve-months period.

Other information

Efficiency enhancement program

Billerud launched a three-year efficiency enhancement program focusing on profitability improvements and with activities spanning across functions predominantly in Region Europe, in the beginning of 2023. The target for the program is an EBITDA uplift of SEK 1.5 billion by the end of 2025 run-rate. During 2023, the efficiency enhancement program delivered an EBITDA-uplift of SEK 615 million.

Cost-reduction measures that involve personnel reductions are being implemented as part of the program since October 2023. The number of positions in the Group will be reduced by up to 350. These measures are expected to generate annual structural savings of SEK 300 million, with majority of the run-rate savings in 2024. Restructuring costs related to the personnel reductions of SEK 80 million were recorded in the fourth quarter of 2023.

For 2024, the target for the efficiency enhancement program is an EBITDA improvement of SEK 700 million compared with 2023. During the first nine months of 2024, the program had a positive impact of around SEK 610 million compared with the period January–September of 2023.

Currency hedging

Currency hedging had a net sales impact of SEK 60 million (-54) in the third quarter and SEK 18 million (-294) for the first nine months of 2024 compared with no currency hedging. The outstanding forward exchange contracts on 30 September had a market value of SEK 117 million, of which SEK 42 million is the portion of the contracts matched by trade receivables that affected earnings in the third quarter. Accordingly, other contracts had a market value of SEK 75 million.

Tax

The tax cost for the first nine months of 2024 amounted to SEK 277 million (-274 (revenue)), equal to approximately 23% (-51) of profit before tax. The low tax rate in the first nine months of 2023 was related to US tax credits for prior years, for which a deferred tax asset was recognized in the third quarter.

Parent company

The parent company Billerud AB (publ) includes head office and support functions.

Operating profit/loss for the first nine months of 2024 was SEK -263 million (-545). The operating result includes the effects of hedging contracts and revaluations of trade receivables.

The parent company hedges both its own and the Group's net currency flows. The parent company's result includes the results of these hedging measures. These effects were SEK 18 million (-294) for the first nine months of 2024.

The average number of employees on 30 September 2024 was 176 (169).

Cash and bank balances, and short-term investments amounted to SEK 354 million (429).

Holding of treasury shares

In the second quarter of 2024, Billerud transferred 153,068 shares under the performance based long-term share program resolved by the 2021 Annual General Meeting. The amount of treasury shares on 31 March 2024 was 1,059,569 and on 30 June 2024, the holding of treasury shares was 906,501. In the third quarter 2024, the number of treasury shares was unchanged.

On 30 September 2024, the total number of shares in Billerud was 249,611,422 and the number of shares in the market was 248,704,921.

Annual General Meeting

The 2025 Annual General Meeting will be held in Stockholm on May 20, 2025. Shareholders wishing to have matters considered at the Annual General Meeting should submit their proposals in writing to Billerud AB (publ), Att: Andreas Mattsson, General Counsel, Box 703, SE-169 27 Solna, Sweden, at least seven weeks before the Annual General Meeting, to ensure the matter can be included in the convening notice for the meeting. Notified matters can be included in the agenda only if they are suitable for decision by the Meeting and if notification is provided in due time. Further details on how and when to provide notification of participation will be published in advance of the meeting.

Nomination Committee

In accordance with the resolution by the Annual General meeting of Billerud, the Chairman of the Board of Directors has convened a Nomination Committee for the 2025 Annual General Meeting, appointed by the major shareholders in the company.

The Nomination Committee consists of Anders Oscarsson, appointed by AMF Pension & Funds, Michael M.F. Kaufmann, appointed by Frapag Beteiligungsholding AG, Jan Särlvik, appointed by Fourth Swedish National Pension Fund and Oscar Bergman appointed by Swedbank Robur Funds.

Risks and uncertainties

Billerud is exposed to risks that could impact its ability to achieve its strategic objectives. The strategic risks include risks related to political initiatives, laws and regulations, the economic outlook and market trends, competition, climate change, cyber-crime, and security. Billerud is also exposed to execution risks that could impact its ability to achieve established objectives in daily operations.

Demand for Billerud's products is affected by market trends and business cycles. A severe economic downturn could negatively impact the demand for the company's products. Competition and production capacity changes in the paper and packaging industry could have an impact on Billerud's business. Geopolitical risks could affect the macroeconomic development, supply chains, price trends and Billerud's operating costs. The war in Ukraine and EU's sanctions on Russia led for example to higher energy prices and a tighter wood market in the Nordics.

There are also risks related to the implications for Billerud of political initiatives, new laws and regulations. A patchwork of requirements that affects the forest and packaging industry is evolving at international and national levels, including for example the EU Emission Trading Scheme (EU ETS), and the Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR).

As a large international company, Billerud is exposed to financial risks related to currency, financing, liquidity, interest rates, energy price, financial credit- and customer credit risks. Most of the Group's revenues are invoiced in foreign currencies while a large part of operating expenses are in SEK.

A detailed risk description including a sensitivity analysis with estimated profit impact of changed sales volumes, exchange rates, loan rates, and input prices is provided on pages 47–51 in the 2023 Annual and Sustainability Report. Detailed information about the Group's financial risks and risk management is provided on pages 76-78 in the 2023 Annual and Sustainability Report.

Introduction

We have reviewed the condensed interim financial information (interim report) of Billerud AB (publ) as of 30 September 2024 and the nine-month period then ended. The Board of Directors and the Managing Director are responsible for the preparation and presentation of this interim report in accordance with IAS 34 and the Annual Accounts Act. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this interim report based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements ISRE 2410 Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and other generally accepted auditing practices and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the interim report is not prepared, in all material respects, for the Group in accordance with IAS 34 and the Annual Accounts Act, and for the Parent Company in accordance with the Annual Accounts Act.

Seasonal effects

Billerud's business is subject to seasonal fluctuations to a relatively limited extent. Periodical maintenance shutdowns have the largest impact, as they involve each unit stopping production for around one week. The loss of production results in somewhat lower deliveries over an extended period before, during and after the shutdown. It should also be noted that the Group usually has a somewhat higher cost level in the fourth quarter than in previous quarters.

Planned maintenance shutdowns

In addition to ongoing maintenance during production, Billerud's production units normally also require more extensive maintenance at some time during the year. Maintenance requires the production of pulp, paper and board to stop. The main financial impact from a maintenance shutdown comprises of volume losses arising from the shutdown and increase in fixed costs, mainly maintenance and overtime costs, as well as a certain portion of variable costs including higher consumption of electricity and wood when production is restarted. The effects of shutdowns on earnings vary depending on volume losses, extent of the measures carried out, their nature and the actual length of the shutdown. The estimated earnings impact of a maintenance shutdown is an indicative impact of a normal shutdown performed in average market conditions compared

with a quarter during which no periodic maintenance shutdown takes place.

From 2024 the estimated cost impact of a maintenance shutdown is calculated as the sum of the fixed costs for the maintenance, increased variable costs associated with the shutdown and lower fixed cost coverage from reduced capacity utilization during the stops.

The estimated cost impact of the maintenance shutdown at Gruvön in 2024 was incorrectly stated in the year-end report and the annual and sustainability report for 2023. The table below has been corrected as of the interim report for January-March 2024.

During the third quarter of 2024, maintenance shutdowns were carried out in Gävle, Karlsborg and Escanaba. The total cost impact of maintenance shutdowns during this period was SEK 348 million.

The maintenance shutdown at Escanaba, that was carried out during September and October, is expected to have a cost impact of approximately SEK 20 million in the fourth quarter.
